TRASH COLLECTION

Waste Industries, a residential waste collection company, is offering a reduced cost collection program to Myrtle Trace residents for the disposal of garbage, yard debris and recyclables. The collection program is voluntary for residents that are interested. Current customers of Waste Industries will receive the reduced cost for services they are provided. Myrtle Trace residents have the following options for service:

Curbside collection one (1) time per week \$8.50 per month, per home (no additional fees or surcharges). Weekly yard debris removal will be \$4.50 per home. Waste Industries will provide a 96-gallon or 65-gallon container for garbage, or will empty the homeowner's receptacle. The yard debris removal is limited to five 33-gallon bags per week.

Garbage and yard debris is picked up each Thursday. Recycling is collected every other Wednesday. The cost is firm for 36 months.

The program will be effective on February 1, 2012. If interested, residents should contact the Waste Industries Office at 397-5586 with their choice of service. Homeowners need to identify themselves as Myrtle Trace residents to participate in the program. Electronic waste such as old TV's or computer equipment, are not accepted and should be disposed of at a local recycling center.

Residents should contact Waste Industries for answers to any questions.

HOMEOWNERS' DUES

The \$ 5.00 increase in the monthly homeowners' dues was approved to take effect on January 1, 2012. Therefore, the rate of \$ 65.00 per month became effective this month. Hopefully, this information will clear up any misunderstanding.
