VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION BRUNCH

Almost 120 residents were honored on January 28th at the Clubhouse for their service to Myrtle Trace and the surrounding community. After hearing a few words of appreciation from Board President Cathy McElroy, the group was entertained by our outstanding community chorus.

Over 150 residents reported their annual volunteer hours in support of the management of Myrtle Trace along with contributions to 77 organizations in Horry County. These organizations include churches, schools, civic organizations and various charities. The total number of hours reported was 36,013. This is the equivalent of over 17 full-time year-round workers and represents over \$425,000 in wages at \$12.00 per hour! The Board is extremely proud of our volunteers and extends its sincere thanks to each of them.

GARDEN CLUB

The Garden Club will present a program featuring a local land-scape designer, Louise Rownd, on Thursday, February 2nd at 3PM in the Clubhouse and all interested Tracers are invited to attend. Ms. Rownd is a long time resident of this area and has extensive knowledge of plant species which are most compatible to coastal weather conditions. She was awarded her Landscape Design degree through a cooperative effort between Horry-Georgetown Technical College and Brookgreen Gardens several years ago. Her remarks should be of great interest to both those who are newcomers to this area and to those who have lived here for some time.

The month of December was not very kind to our landscape plants - less than ½ inch of rainfall was recorded. That, and the unusually warm weather, prevented many of our plants from "hardening-off" in preparation for frosty or freezing weather. As a result, certain camellia varieties failed to bloom properly and even the foliage of our Bradford Pears clung to the branches well into December, thereby creating an extended clean-up effort on the part of our maintenance staff. If you haven't already done so, be sure to check the soil moisture in your yard and irrigate if needed – this will be a vital step for the continued health of your landscape.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Repairs to the pavement in the parking lot in front of Clubhouse have been completed. The two vacuum cleaners in the Clubhouse have been repaired and are ready for use.

During the past few months, there have been wheel chairs and walkers borrowed from the storeroom in the Clubhouse but the borrowers have failed to complete the Sign Out / Sign In log on the bulletin board. It would be greatly appreciated if entries could be made in the log whenever wheel chairs, walkers, crutches, tables or chairs are borrowed.

We have 123 acres of retention ponds within the community and we are governed by the Clean Water Act. Guidelines for the use of herbicides and pesticides have been tightened in an effort to reduce the amount of chemicals introduced into the waterways. The guidelines are enforced by DHEC. Myrtle Trace is reducing the amount of herbicides used by installing aeration systems on three lakes (Swallow, Hummingbird, and Oriole). The results during the coming year will be closely monitored to see if the program should be expanded.




