BOARD BRIEFS

HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS

During the past few months, there have been numerous letters of complaint in the Sun News regarding perceived abuses and mismanagement by area homeowners associations. These complaints unfairly tend to give a "black eye" to all HOA's. Since our owners assumed total control of the Association in 1991, the MTHOA has been operated in a completely open manner by more than 100 volunteer owners. All of our meetings are open and our financial records are available for review by any interested owner. All rulings and decisions are made in the best interest of the entire community. We have a homeowners association we can all be proud of.

PROTECTION OF PROPERTY VALUES

In the April issue, we were reminded of the need for "protection of the Myrtle Trace community in the event of loss of property". This need is the basis of each member's obligation to maintain and demonstrate the continued existence of replacement cost insurance coverage on the member's property.

Damaged or destroyed property remains a blight on the community until it has been repaired, restored or rebuilt. Members of the Association can expect that all debris of a casualty loss will be expeditiously removed and necessary restoration to the preexisting condition will be completed as rapidly as possible in a manner compatible with the community's architectural standards. Each member is expected to assure the Association that their deeded property remains insured in compliance with our Covenants and will not impact on the community's property values in the event of a casualty loss.

On the occasion of any insurance policy change and upon each annual renewal, a copy of the "Declaration" page of the member's policy should be forwarded to the Association. It can be dropped in the "Homeowners" slot at the Clubhouse or mailed to MTHOA, Inc., 101 Myrtle Trace Drive, Conway, SC 29526.

COMMON PROPERTY MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

The Board will once again consider individual homeowner applications for a Maintenance Agreement to assume responsibility in the care of all common areas immediately adjoining their respective residences. Strict guidelines are spelled out in the Agreement as to the maintenance. The Agreement is subject to Board approval and the Board may withhold, cancel, or disapprove said Maintenance Agreement. Please contact your Phase Representative during the month of May if you are interested in applying for a Maintenance Agreement.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The pool is ready for the season! The new filtration system is working and the decks have been cleaned and sealed. A special thanks to Kelly Bledsoe for power washing the concrete deck. The pool officially opens on Tuesday, May 1.

The back wall of the Clubhouse, damaged by water, has been repaired. The new design will prevent future damage. The oven in the Clubhouse has not been heating well, but the problem has been diagnosed as a faulty thermostat. It is consistently low, so if you are using the lower oven, set the temperature at 50 degrees above the desired temperature.

Most of the sodding has been completed. There are some areas which need additional treatment, e.g., for bugs, weeds, roots or excessive shade, before final grass can be put in place. It is costly and inefficient to put new sod down to suffer the same fate as its predecessor. Please remember that it is the responsibility of the property owner to water the adjacent common property. On new sodded areas, please water liberally for a few weeks.

The signage by the back gate to Myrtle Ridge Drive will be changed due to the extensive calling by non-residents trying to cut through. For those exiting, the telephone numbers will be prefaced by: RESI-DENTS ONLY CALL:. On the incoming side, the phone numbers will be removed and a second RESI-DENTS ONLY sign will be placed by the gate. If there is a problem with the gates for residents, please call the numbers in the directory when you get home to alert us of the problem. Also, please remind visitors and family to enter and exit by Burning Ridge Road because the gate is by permit only even though a GPS may lead them to the gates.
