PROPERTY COMMITTEE

If you have an issue with the Common Properties, please contact your Phase Representative. Please do not go to Al Hardee or his crew directly, except in special circumstances, as in the next paragraph.

At least one raccoon has been seen frequenting the neighborhood. These cute animals are often rabid and they should be avoided. Do not go near them and do not feed them or leave food out, especially pet food. They are clever animals and often avoid capture. The Association does have traps. If a raccoon is frequenting your property, contact Al Hardee for the trap or call your Phase Rep for help. Once captured, call Animal Control (248-1520) for removal.

Before you dig in your yard to plant a bush, you should be aware of a law requiring you to avoid utility lines which you may hit as you dig. No matter how large or small the digging project is, it is important to "Call Before You Dig" or "Click Before You Dig!" By making a FREE phone call to 811 or by simply filling out an online form you can protect yourself and the community from costly fines, repairs, personal injury or inconvenient outages. There is a website at www.sc1pups.org for help and guidance.

There are a few vacant homes in Myrtle Trace which are not being cared for properly. Many times the Association does not know and the house could present a hazard. If a house near you falls into this category please let the Architectural Review Committee know about it.

We are in need of more Pool Monitors. This is not lifeguarding, but we need the presence of responsible individuals to give guidance, be sure residents sign in and to keep the pool area neat and safe. If you can volunteer two hours a week, please contact Charlene Rose or Christine Weber.
