

GARDEN CLUB

Like most areas of the country, we are experiencing some major hot and dry weather patterns and our landscaping and garden plants are in dire need of daily attention on the part of all of us. We all know the importance of water for continued plant growth and therein lies another problem. Be very careful to avoid over-watering of your plants—this can lead to severe stress problems because of too much water surrounding the fragile root system. Just use common sense and moderation when watering.

For those of you with Crape Myrtles in your landscape, be sure to prune off all flowers after they have died. This will encourage the plant to produce a new set of blooms within a short period of time. Done properly, it is possible for Crape Myrtles to produce as many as 4 sets of blossoms during the summer and early fall.




