THE GATES AT MYRTLE RIDGE DRIVE

The old steel gates have been removed from the entrance and the remaining improvements will be completed within the next few weeks.

DID YOU KNOW??

There are two distinct sections of pipe connecting your home to the GSW&SA water supply. The first section is the connection from the water main to your water meter. The second section is the pipe from the meter to the main shutoff valve at the foundation of the house. GSW&SA has full responsibility for any repairs required for the first section. On the other hand, the second section is the responsibility of the homeowner. GSW&SA offers an "insurance" program for \$2.75 per month which will cover any repairs required on the second section. The program also covers any repairs to the sewer line from the house to the street. Considering the prevalence of tree roots on many lots, this insurance program might be worth considering. GARDEN CLUB

The next regular meeting of the Garden Club will be on Thursday, November 15th at 1:30pm in the Clubhouse – as is usual, all interested Tracers are invited to attend. Our guest speaker will be Debbie Menchek, Master Gardener and weekly garden columnist of the Myrtle Beach Sun News and her topic will be "Weather Challenges for Gardeners and Garden Plants".

Within climatic reason, it is still not too late to make some fall plantings – especially with regard to bulbs and certain other cold-tolerant ornamental plants (come to the November meeting and hear what Debbie has to say.) By doing so, adequate root development can occur, thereby assuring strong growth/ and/or flowering next spring. One word of caution however — do not apply too much fertilizer at this time.

If squirrels or other bulb-loving critters have been a problem in your garden, simply liberally dust the bulbs with red pepper or paprika when planting – this simple procedure has been used by gardeners with a high degree of success for many years.

One additional note – be sure to maintain adequate soil moisture during the winter months by watering when little or no rainfall takes place.
