BOARD BRIEFS

LATE HOURS CONSTRUCTION

Our spillway structure for Lake Cormorant between 228 and 232 Wedgewood Lane has rusted out and the water level cannot be maintained. The outflow passes through the neighboring golf course property into their pond system. We have their approval to replace our outflow lines on their property in a manner which minimizes interference with the golf course operation. Our contractor will work between the hours of three in the afternoon and eight the following morning at which time the cart path must be passable for their members and guests. The work must be completed by February 8, 2013 and may take more than one day. We will strive to minimize the disturbance to our community during the late evening work activity.

TREE PRUNING

We understand there has been some concern expressed regarding our winter pruning of many of the trees in our community - particularly the Bradford Pear trees. Although the pruning appears to be rather extreme, it has been done successfully in previous years. Many of these trees are approaching the end of their expected lifetime and require more attention. Removing the large branches above the main trunk reduces the weight and lowers the wind resistance which in turn will reduce the frequency of branches splitting. Although we won't have the beautiful blossoms we're accustomed to this spring, they will return in the coming years.

GARDEN CLUB

Regular monthly meetings of the Garden Club will resume on Thursday, Feb. 7th, at 2pm in the Clubhouse and, as usual, all Tracers are invited to attend. The unusual weather patterns of the past few months have created some "quirky" growth responses of many plants in this area of South Carolina - for instance, very early blooming of Quince bushes took place in late December, leaves hung onto the branches of our Bradford Pear trees much later than normal, and certain varieties of irises and daylilies surprised us with profuse blooming in late December and early January. Who knows what other surprises Mother Nature may have for us this coming Spring???

For those of you who have crape myrtles on your property - it is best to prune before late March/early April for best bloom results. Be sure to remove all of those ugly "knots" with sharp pruning tools. Then, if you desire one or more bloom periods during the summer, remove all of the spent flowers as soon as they fade - just cut off the bloom head and new flower buds will form and bloom in a short period of time. Done properly, you can enjoy as many as 3 or 4 bloom periods during the summer and early fall months.

With Spring just around the corner, the usual Saturday morning clean-up of the garden walkways, etc. at 9am will require as much help as we can get - won't you consider joining us?

Use of decoys, such as owl figurines, and shooing them verbally will discourage them from entering your property. If they return, repeat. If your neighbors like them, this approach can keep them away from your property and from returning. This is especially important during the upcoming mating seasons and the later nesting and rearing seasons.

Next month we will be preparing for re-sodding and asking for signed requests, so look at your adjoining Common Property to see if any needs help. Spring rains, watering and applying weed retardants may help, so wait to determine what needs to be done.
