## **BOARD BRIEFS**

#### 2012 AUDIT REPORT

The 2012 audit of the Association's financial records and supporting data has been completed and the auditor reports that they accurately represent the MTHOA's financial position.

#### CLUBHOUSE PARKING LOT

In hopes of reducing potential tripping incidents, the concrete parking bumpers in the parking lot are being painted a bright, reflective yellow. In addition, the installation of more lighting is planned. Everyone walking in the parking lot is asked to please be observant.

#### HISTORY OF THE NEWS & VIEWS

The first issue of the News & Views, published in May of 1992, represented the first formal communication from the homeowner controlled Board of Directors to our community. Prior to that, the developer controlled Board published occasional newsletters.

The very first communication to our residents was a memo from the newly formed Recreation & Entertainment Committee dated November 1, 1984. The Committee consisted of four women and the first social event was a Potluck at poolside on November 3rd! Monthly newsletters commenced in July 1985 and continued almost monthly until October 1987. In November 1987, the committee became the Activities Committee. The monthly newsletters continued often featuring a calendar.

Following the 1990 Annual Meeting, the homeowners assumed control of the MTHOA Board and it soon became evident that a more informative document was needed. A Property Committee and an Architectural Review Committee had been formed and the "doings" of those committees needed to be conveyed to the homeowners. The transition of the HOA from developer controlled to homeowner controlled was a gradual one and plans for a formal newsletter proceeded gradually as well. A name was chosen, the content defined and the first issue of the News & Views was published.

The News & Views started out as a four page document with an occasional flier. The monthly calendar was on the back page or included as a flier. The first 8 page issue was published in June 1997 and that has been the format ever since with fliers inserted as necessary.

Initially, the editor collected news items and delivered them to a layout man who would organize the items, add graphics as necessary and prepare copy for the printer. During the spring of 1997, the Association purchased a software program which would enable the editor to prepare the copy. In 2006, the Association purchased a new copy machine which could staple and fold documents. As a result, the monthly charges from a commercial printer were eliminated.

The first editor of the News & Views was Ray Moritz. He served for two years and was replaced by Louella Stoetzel. She was editor for a year before resigning due to health issues. Ted Ackley became the editor in July 1995.

#### **GARDEN CLUB**

The Garden Club will hold its next meeting in the clubhouse at 2 pm on Thursday, April 4th and, as usual, all Tracers are invited to attend. Since this meeting will involve plans for the forthcoming growing season, your input will be most welcome.

In spite of all the recent bad weather reports from all around the country, we here in South Carolina have not been too adversely affected (other than still needing more rainfall; we are currently about 3 ½ to 4 inches below normal for this time of year. Naturally, as our landscape and garden plants are ready to enter a rapid surge of spring growth, more than normal amounts of water will be needed to support this flush of growth, so be prepared to supply extra water if no rainfall takes place.

At the same time, as temperatures rise, be alert to the possibility of an increase in populations of plant aphids, grubs and other insect pests on our landscape plantings. (Note: Al Hardee's workers have already taken steps to control grub populations in all of our grassed common areas). Should you find a grub problem in your lawn area, don't hesitate to call our County Extension Service for currently recommended control measures (dial 365-6715).



## **2013 Myrtle Trace Pool Rules**

The pool is for the use of residents, their family and/or out of town houses guests only. All users are to comply with the posted Department of Health Environmental Control (DHEC) regulations and the following rules:

Residents are required to sign in and list any guests with the pool monitor that is on duty. After 5:30 P.M. Sign-in sheets are located on the table under the cabana roof.

Swim at your own risk. Swimming alone is strongly discouraged. The Pool Monitor is there to see that our rules are obeyed, not to be a lifeguard!

Children under the age of 16 may use the pool only when accompanied by the resident or a responsible adult.

Children, who are NOT POTTY TRAINED, are not permitted in the pool. There is a portable pool located in the storage area for the use of these toddlers. Water may be bucketed from the pool for this purpose. When draining the Toddler Pool, please make sure the pool water is dumped on the grass away from the swimming pool.

Appropriate swimming attire must be worn.

Diving into the pool is NOT PERMITTED. Jumping will be permitted only when it does not interfere with the safety or enjoyment of the other swimmers.

Inflatable Safety & Flotation devices for non-swimming children are permitted only under proper supervision of an adult and only in the shallow end of the pool. Rafts, inner tubes, fins, and snorkels are NOT PERMITTED. Children's toys and devices not designed for water sports and play are also NOT PERMITTED.

No playing on or removing of lifeline/rope.

CLEAR POOL AREA upon first incident of THUNDER and/or LIGHTNING.

NO SMOKING inside pool fenced area.

Deposit all trash in the trash receptacles.

Upon leaving the pool area, please return all children's toys to the storage room. Also, please close your umbrella.

When POOL MONITOR NOT ON DUTY, the last person using the pool should lock the gate.
