## **BOARD BRIEFS**

### TRAFFIC SAFETY

The special Traffic Safety Committee, chaired by Nancy Southard and including Leo Reger, Mike Reynolds, Dave Smyth and Jim Wilkison, presented a comprehensive traffic study to the Board at the June meeting. The conclusions of the study indicate that 96% of the traffic moves at speeds below 28 MPH and the average speed is 20 MPH. Therefore, no further action is deemed necessary. Suggested guidelines prepared by the Committee are included on an enclosed flier. The Committee completed an outstanding analysis.

#### SMOKE DETECTORS

A representative from the Horry County Fire Department gave a presentation on Fire Safety at a recent Pot Luck Supper. During the presentation, it was stated that smoke detectors have a useful life of about 10 years. Given the age of our community, it is very likely that we have numerous detectors which have exceeded their useful life. As a public service to Myrtle Trace, Steve Sands has developed a program to assist homeowners in the replacement of inoperative detectors. A flier is included in this issue of the News & Views describing the program. Each of you is encouraged to give careful consideration to this program.

#### NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The Nominating Committee for the 2014 Annual Meeting will soon be meeting to search for homeowners who wish to be considered for candidacy for a seat on the Board of Directors. Two current board members will be replaced at the February 2014 Annual Meeting. The Traffic Safety Committee makes the following recommendations regarding the use of our streets. If we all cooperate, we will continue to enjoy trouble-free traffic!

## Pedestrians:

Share the road.

Walkers, alone or with pets, and joggers should walk facing oncoming traffic.

Wear a reflective vest at night and early morning.

Step to the edge of the road when traffic is approaching.

Carry a flashlight at night when walking a pet and make sure the pet is off the road when a vehicle is approaching.

## Bicyclists:

Share the road.

Ride with the traffic.

Wear a reflective vest.

Move to the side and let vehicles pass on your left.

Have a working headlight and backlight on your bicycle for use at night and early morning hours.

Obey stop signs.

## Vehicles:

Share the road.

Obey stop signs and posted speed limits.

Adjust speed for traffic conditions especially when there is a vehicle stopped along the side of the road and there is oncoming traffic.

# The effective life of a smoke detector is ten years according to the Horry County Fire Department.

Most detectors in Phases 1 - 7 are at least 20 years old. The detectors in Phase 8 are at least 12 years old.

These older smoke detectors should be replaced as soon as possible.

The older the detectors are, the less effective they are.

Just because the buzzer goes off when you push the button does not mean they are going to detect smoke during a fire.

It just means there is power to them.

A deal is being worked out with Lowe's to get us new smoke detectors at a substantial discount if we buy a lot of them.

Any one who wishes to replace their smoke detectors, please notify Steve Sands. He will make a list of detectors needed, and then get a price from Lowe's.

Any one who needs help putting in their smoke detectors will be contacted by the Horry County Fire Department, and they will come over at no charge and replace them for you.
