GARDEN CLUB

I thought spring had arrived until several cold nights a few weeks ago. Then, we were hit again with a cold blast from the north. Most plants should have survived with little problem.

The garden has been in bloom for the last month or so with a multitude of colors. The daffodils and mahonia are finished for the season but the azaleas are just beginning their flush of color. You will see bright shades of pink, red and white plus the brilliant yellow in the middle of the garden. The native azaleas along the left side pathway are a real treat if you take the time to go and enjoy their fragrance.

This is the time of year you may see the Eastern Tent Caterpillar appear in the branches of your trees and shrubs. The caterpillar feeds on the tender leaves and may completely defoliate the host plant. The plant will rarely die due to no leaves and will show signs of recovery in a few weeks.

Many early blooming shrubs have finished their display of color and are ready to be pruned. Pruning can not only shape your shrub it can encourage new growth. Be on the lookout for scale, aphids and sooty mold on crape myrtles. Treat these pests early before they become a real problem.

Can't wait to get your hands in the garden soil? Plant those summer blooming bulbs such as dahlias, cannas, gladioli and caladiums. They will give you some great summer blooms.
