3. DO NOT prune your azaleas. You will be removing the buds of the spring blooms.
4. Divide your large clumps of hosta, day lilies, mondo grass, and ferns.
5. Plant fall flowering perennials such as pansies & violas.
6. Sow seeds for spring bloomers such as poppies, sweet-peas, snap dragons & others.

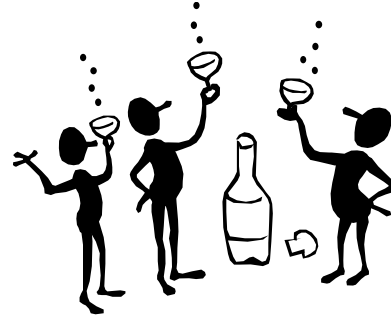

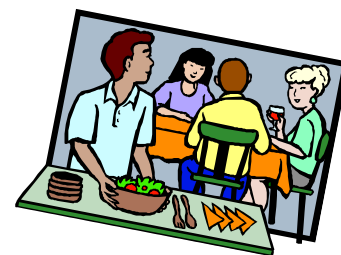
