THANK YOU, LILLIE



TRUCK PARKING

Questions continue to be raised about the guidelines for truck parking in Myrtle Trace.

The Covenants state "No commercial vehicles or likeshall be permitted on the Properties except on a temporary basis. Parking of trucks, trailers..... are prohibited on the Properties...."

The dictionary defines temporary as follows: lasting, existing or effective for a short time only, not permanent; an arrangement established with no thought of continuance but with the idea of being changed soon; that which is in the process of passing by, and which will there-



fore last or stay only a short time.

All residents are asked to follow the Covenants, both with their personal trucks and with trucks and trailers belonging to contractors doing work on their property.

HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE REQUIREMENT

Have you provided the Myrtle Trace HOA evidence of homeowners insurance? The Covenants require this as a protection for the community and its residents. The reasoning for this requirement is evident. If a home is damaged or destroyed, failure to clear the debris and rebuild would harm both the beauty and value of all properties.

As of October, over 300

homes have failed to provide evidence of current coverage. In many cases this is due to a policy expiring or a change in insurance companies with updated information not being provided.

It is very easy to comply with the requirement. Copy the Declaration Page of your current policy and place it in the HOA mail slot by the front door of the Clubhouse.

Your prompt attention to this matter is appreciated.

VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION

Our annual recognition of Myrtle Trace volunteers, normally held in January, will be celebrated on April 12, 2015. The change is being made for two reasons. PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Locating and repairing leaks in the pool has been an ongoing project since early October. Many small leaks were repaired around the tiles and all of the skimmer tiles have been replaced. On Thursday, November 20th, a portion of the wooden deck was removed to provide access to a broken pipe. The break was located using an electronic listening device. The repairmen believe all leaks have now been located and repaired; they will pump water back into the pool and again monitor the water level. The next phase of the pool renovation, the resurfacing of the concrete decking, is scheduled to be done before the end of the year.

Al Hardee's staff has been very busy removing leaves and pine straw from the common areas, including the lakes. This has become a weekly cycle and they will continue this effort thru the month. A few reminders: 1) Homeowners are NOT to rake leaves or pine straw from their private property onto the common area and expect Al Hardee's crew to pick it up. It is the homeowner's responsibility to remove and dispose of the leaves and pine straw that falls on their property. 2) Homeowner's who have signed a maintenance agreement are responsible for removing leaves and pine straw from their property and the common areas adjacent to their property. 3) Leaves and pine straw are not to be intentionally blown or raked into the lakes, or thrown into the ditches.

The Board of Directors, during the November meeting, awarded the clubhouse cleaning contract to Ms. Deborah Woiculevicz, effective December 1st. Ms. Woiculevicz moved to Myrtle Beach from Massachusetts. Many residents may not have the opportunity to meet her since the Clubhouse is cleaned twice a week usually around 5:30 a.m.

Within the next couple of weeks you may notice road work being done along Myrtle Trace Drive. Cracks in the road seams are being repaired. As always, drive with caution especially while this work is being done.


