PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Residents who have been in the area of the pool may have noticed a flurry (not snow) of activity. The renovations to the pool area are well under way. All wooden decking and railings have been removed. The workers are digging around the reconfigured perimeter in preparation for putting in the footers. Concrete will then be poured for the new ramp and pool deck area. In addition, aluminum fencing and gates will be installed. The tile floors in the restrooms have been removed, drains put in place and a new textured concrete floor will be poured and painted. The work being done on the pool will bring it into compliance with South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) regulations. The work is scheduled to be completed by April 15, 2015. When the pool reopens for the season in May, we will also have new tables, chairs, umbrellas and umbrella stands.

IMPORTANT – TIME SENSITIVE INFORMATION

- 1. <u>Sod Replacement</u> It is time to start thinking about sod replacement. The request form can be found in this issue of *News & Views* and on the Myrtle Trace website. The form has been revised and homeowners will receive a written statement as to what will be done in regard to the replacement of sod. For residents requesting sod replacement, the completed form must be received by the Property Committee Chairperson *no later than* Monday, April 13, 2015. Late applications <u>will not</u> be accepted.
- 2. Common Ground Maintenance Agreement March is the month in which individual homeowners may apply and be considered for a Common Ground Maintenance Agreement. Under this agreement homeowners assume the responsibility for maintaining the common areas adjoining their deeded property. Homeowners wishing to take on this responsibility should contact their phase representative. He or she will provide you with a copy of the form and will review the guidelines with you. Each application is subject to Board approval. Completed applications must be received by the Property Committee Chairperson by Tuesday, March 31, 2015. Late applications will not be accepted.
