GARDEN CLUB

For those of you who are itching to get out and garden, here are a couple of tips for April. Summer flowering bulbs such as Crocosmia, Dahlia and Lillies are ready to be planted. Also, if you have Cannas, now is a good time to dig and divide and replant. Plant new roses early to get them settled before summer's heat and humidity arrive. If you have little room for roses plan to go vertical with climbing roses. Use existing structures such as lampposts or porch columns. Start hanging baskets early in April. Impatients and Begonias do well in the shade while Marigolds, Petunias, Scaevolas, Verbenas and Vincas do well in full sun. Portulaca is wonderful in baskets as it tolerates the hot sun and drought. 



POSITION AVAILABLE

The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association will, through April 14, 2015, accept applications, from members of the Association, to fill the position of Administrative Consultant beginning on January 1, 2016.

The person selected must attend all regular meetings of the Board of Directors and such other meetings as the President of the Board shall request, prepare a draft annual Association budget and schedule of repairs and replacements for presentation to the Board, prepare a monthly financial report and summary (year-to-date) and present same to the Association Treasurer at least one week prior to each regular monthly Board meeting, prepare and furnish necessary 1099 forms to all persons eligible to receive them from the Association, assist the Association's tax accountant with all financial data necessary to a timely completion of Association taxes, coordinate with Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable to reconcile all financial records, provide to the audit firm all documents necessary for the annual audit and maintain all records in a computerized format. The person selected shall maintain an historic data base of pertinent corporate records and provide the Board, at least annually, with a listing of all records so maintained.

The person selected shall also serve as the Association's Contract Administrator. He or she shall prepare or negotiate the preparation of such contracts as are assigned by the Board to his or her purview, obtaining the best cost and performance for the Association's benefit. In the instance of any dispute or of the nonperformance of any contract term the Administrative Consultant shall endeavor to negotiate a settlement. The person selected shall undertake such other duties as he or she agrees to with the Board.

To become familiar with the aforesaid duties and the manner in which they have been performed by the current holder of the position, the successful applicant agrees to observe the present Administrative Consultant in his fulfillment of those duties for the balance of 2015.

In their resumes, all applicants shall cite educational attainments, pertinent past work experience in the accounting and/or bookkeeping field, must be able to read and/or prepare such financial statements as budgets, balance sheets and income statements and must have some proficiency in the utilization of Quickbooks or similar such bookkeeping software.

The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association is a nonprofit enterprise entirely dependent upon the monthly assessment imposed upon its members to fill its financial needs. Applicants should not anticipate that the monetary consideration offered the successful applicant will be competitive with that available for similar work in the business community.
