VOLUNTEER CELEBRATION

On Sunday, April 12th, Myrtle Trace celebrated the efforts of more than 110 resident volunteers who contributed 20,594 hours of time to Myrtle Trace and the surrounding community during 2014. Over 80 volunteers enjoyed refreshments and a video presentation of the various volunteer activities. Twenty volunteers led by Mary Johnsen staged the affair. The largest beneficiary of Myrtle Trace efforts was the Conway Medical Center with 2,992 hours. Others in Horry County included Trinity United Methodist Church with 1,555 and the Kingston Nursing Home with 1,022. Internally, the Property Committee devoted 1,963 hours to our community followed by the Board of Directors with 1,105. The M T Community Chorus spent 2,328 hours fine-tuning their talents for the enjoyment of our residents.

The residents of Myrtle Trace continue to display the compassion and generosity they have been known for during the past 30 years.

GARDEN CLUB

Tips for May. If you haven't already done so, move your house plants outdoors to a shady spot. It's a good time to repot and fertilize them. Roses – continue to fertilize and keep an eye on bushes for powdery mildew and black spot symptoms. Treat infected plants with a fungicide.

Inspect the underside of camellia leaves for red spider mites and scale. If you spot either, apply horticulture oil. Fertilize gardenias and azaleas. Centipede grass needs little fertilizer and minimal nitrogen. Zoysia and warm season Bermuda prefer high nitrogen fertilizer.

Incorporate herbs into existing planting areas as edge borders. Gather herbs early in the morning when flavors are strongest and put stems in water until cooking time. Happy gardening!
