BOARD BRIEFS

AMENDMENTS TO CLUBHOUSE RULES

At its May meeting, the Board of Directors approved two amendments to the rules governing the use of the Clubhouse.

Dogs, cats and other domesticated pets are not allowed in the Clubhouse at any time. This restriction does not apply to registered Service Dogs.

Changes or modifications to the new sound system are to be made only by trained professionals and only with the prior approval of the Board of Directors. No other persons are authorized to alter the system in any way.

SPEEDING

From time to time, it becomes necessary to remind our residents that the legal speed limit on the streets throughout Myrtle Trace is 25 miles per hour. Since we have no sidewalks, motor vehicles must share the streets with walkers, joggers and bikers. In addition, most of our residents back out of their driveways into the streets. Vehicles exceeding the speed limit present a potential hazard to drivers entering the street. The Board encourages each of us to be considerate of our neighbors and obey the posted speed limit.

POOL REFURBISHMENT

The special Pool Refurbishment Committee did an outstanding job of planning, executing and monitoring a major overhaul of the Myrtle Trace pool area. Necessary repairs were identified and implemented including the elimination of the infamous pool leaks! A new pool deck was installed, a new, attractive fence was put in place and new furniture was purchased. Most of the improvements to the Cabana have also been completed. Property Committee Chairperson Nancy Southard chaired the special committee which included Luise Henry, Mary Johnsen (until she was elected to the Board), Emily Kaplan, Thor Kongvold, Mike Reynolds, Paul Sallas and Dan Seeds. The Board deeply appreciates the efforts of this excellent committee.

GARDEN CLUB


