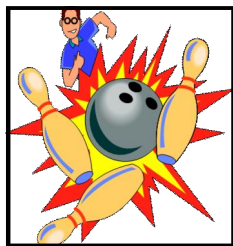

GARDEN CLUB

Here are some seasonal plant maintenance hints from your Myrtle Trace Garden Club.

It's time to plant pansies, violas, mums for fall color and to put in bulbs for spring blooms.

Lightly fertilize azalea, camellia and hydrangea as well as your lawn. Remove spent hydrangea flower heads. Do NOT prune azaleas, you'll remove next spring's buds.

Divide clumps of day lilies, hastas, fern, Shasta daisies, etc. replant at the same depth or plan to bring them to the Plant Exchange on Oct. 17th - see info page elsewhere in this issue.

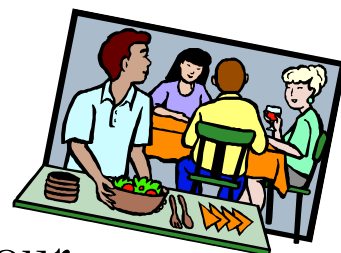
