GARDEN CLUB

Here's an easy project for colorful blooms in November and in the spring taken from Bob Polomski's book; *CAROLINAS Month-By-Month Gardening*.

Fill a plastic container (so it won't crack during the winter) one-third full with potting soil. Next place bulbs (any variety) in the pot with pointy ends up. Pack in as many bulbs as will fit in one layer.

Add more potting soil until the container is two-thirds to three fourths full to ensure the bulbs are planted deep enough. Leave room to add more potting soil and annual flowers on top.

Next, add cool-weather annuals, such as pansies or flowering kale to the container. Perennials may be planted as well. Be sure to place them close together in the container for maximum blooms & color.

Fill potting soil around the annuals and/or perennials leaving ½ to 1 inch from the top of the soil to the rim of the container.

Finally, water the container and leave outside all winter. Water at least once a week unless the pot is frozen solid. The bulbs will grow up through the plants. And please share your project results with us.
