BOARD BRIEFS

2016 MTHOA BUDGET

The 2016 Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association budget, after careful consideration and taking into account increases in our annual operating expenses, was adopted at the November meeting of the Board of Directors. A copy is enclosed with this newsletter.

We are confident this budget will allow us to meet our obligations, along with permitting us to fund a number of projects which will address the current and future needs of our aging community infrastructure.

While the Property Committee has been charged with the operation and maintenance of our retention basins, we have never established a fund to be prepared to address the future needs of our lakes. Besides considering the financial aspect of this project, a special ad hoc committee has been formed and is working diligently to be able to recommend a program of maintenance designed to preserve the health and forestall the need for costly solutions.

We are also researching how to address the need to improve the safety of access our storage in the Clubhouse and will carefully consider all options provided. Funding for both of these projects are outlined under Projects Scheduled in the budget.

Therefore, in order to maintain and preserve Myrtle Trace in the manner we've become accustomed to, the Board has approved a dues increase of \$5.00 per month, raising the member obligation to \$75.00 per month or \$900.00 per year for 2016, still allowing us to offer one of the lowest HOA fees in the area.

It's always the Board's intention that any expenditures, whether from our operating budget or dues increase, benefit the community as a whole, as evidenced by the projects completed in 2015.

Our pool, after almost 30 years, underwent extensive repairs including the replacement of its wooden deck, installation of a regulatorily compliant aluminum fence and the purchase of furniture. We were also able to complete additional phases of our Clubhouse Refurbishment Plan and a new sound system was installed.

Because of prudent management of operating expenses, we anticipate being able to complete a five-year plan for the lake bank retention walls, in only four years.

However, one of the most important components of being able to continue to offer an affordable HOA dues, is owing to your involvement in Myrtle Trace. We could not provide the quality of life and services we enjoy and have come to expect, without the assistance of so many of our residents. Thank you for your willingness to give of your time and talents.



PROPERTY COMMITTEE - Rollercoaster!

Recently, temperatures have been like a roller coaster; one day warm the next day cool and some mornings have been nippy. It's that time of year, temperatures transitioning from fall to winter. Also, when moving the tables, PUSH on the base. We have found pulling on the legs tends to loosen the leg from the base.

GARDEN CLUB - Did you know...?

The Garden Club, established in 2002, is a non-dues, informal gardening club with a goal of informing Myrtle Trace residents about gardening in the South. From 2002 to 2004 stepping stones were made by Myrtle Trace resident John Beam and the plaques were engraved by an engraver in Conway. You may see all 150 stones as you stroll through the garden in front of the pool.

In 2003 the Myrtle Trace Board requested the Garden Club to formulate a landscape design for the area in front of the Clubhouse. Following the Board's approval, work was begun in early 2004. Al Hardee's maintenance crew prepared the site and the Garden Club was given the responsibility for the planting and care of the area.

Paul Alexander, one of the founding Garden Club members, is a professor emeritus of Clemson University and Horry Tech. This master gardener has shared a wealth of Southern gardening information with Myrtle Trace residents over the years. Paul wrote most of the club's News & Views articles up through August 2013.

John & Judy Beam were instrumental in the landscape designs surrounding the Clubhouse. These knowledgeable gardeners continue to dedicate their time and hard work in the gardens. In 2005, the garden pathways and benches behind the Clubhouse were installed by the Garden Club. The Garden Club is responsible for the maintenance and up keep of the Clubhouse Gardens for the enjoyment of all Myrtle Trace residents.

Through-out the history of the Clubhouse Gardens, many Myrtle Trace residents have volunteered a portion of their time to assist Garden Club members with the maintenance of the Clubhouse garden areas. TAG SALES & ESTATE SALES


