GARDEN CLUB

Rose gardening in our area will be the topic of conversation at the Garden Club meeting on Thursday, March 9th at 1 PM in the Clubhouse. Master Gardener, Club Member and fellow resident Paula Youngs will be available to answer questions about growing roses and will offer hints concerning planning and prepping our landscape gardens as spring approaches. EVERYONE is invited and encouraged to attend.

March is a good time to get outside and tidy up our landscapes. Remove thatch from lawns using a steel-tined rake. Freshen up mulched areas by raking and removing debris. This is also a great time to set out new perennials and to divide and replant those already established in your garden. The best perennials for dividing are clump-forming ones such as phlox, hostas, daylilies, Siberian iris, and old-fashioned chrysanthemums.

BOARD BRIEFS (CONT'D.)

Two residents asked to speak at the annual meeting to express their concerns regarding the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) guideline which addresses covered vehicles, unlicensed and unregistered vehicles being parked in driveways. Specifically, the two residents believed vehicles should be allowed to be covered and stored on a homeowner's property.

The issue of covered vehicles on homeowner property was brought to the Board's attention by ARC in July was discussed at three board meetings prior to being acted on and approved. ARC had received a number of complaints and questions from residents as to why covered vehicles could be stored on the homeowner property when covered boats, campers, utility trailers could not. They also believed their property values were being negatively impacted by the growing presence of covered vehicles on homeowner property.

The Board recognizes that residents want to protect the value of their home which we all know is a major investment. Likewise we acknowledge residents want to protect other investments such as vehicles. However, the Board believes it is in the best interest of the community to prohibit the parking of covered vehicles on homeowner's property in Myrtle Trace.

TREASURERS REPORT

As your Treasurer, I am very pleased to report that we have started 2017 on the right foot. Our cash balances increased over December 2016, by slightly over \$66,000, to a total of \$81,745. This was due in large part to the receipt of slightly over \$50,000 in Prepaid Dues. Thanks to all of you who pay your dues in advance. We do need to remember that these prepaid funds need to be expended over a 12 month period, along with the dues received on a monthly basis. Our Income and Expenses statement shows total income for January was a little more (\$267) than budgeted. Our daily Operating Expenses was under budget by \$4,127 at a total of \$26,172. There were no over budget items occurring in January.

Once our soil testing is completed, hopefully before the end of February, we will begin construction of the Clubhouse addition. Once completed the \$16,900 balance will be paid. However, remember these funds were carried over from the 2016 budget and will not impact the 2017 budget. One other good bit of news is that the \$3,700 carried over from 2016 to cut down the leaning trees was reduced to \$3,200, a savings of \$500. Thanks again Leo Reger for another job well done.

Congratulations to everyone, we have started the year off right.


