A GUIDE FOR PET OWNERS

The Board acknowledges and thanks the majority of pet owners who act in a responsible manner when walking their pet(s) in the Myrtle Trace Community. Unfortunately, a small percentage of pet owners do not exhibit these behaviors.. The following details specific responsibilities and expectations of owners/walkers when walking pets in our community.

Pet owners/walkers are responsible for:

Having the dog OR cat on a leash when not on the homeowner's property, including common areas.

When walking pets it is the responsibility of the walker to pick up the pet's droppings, in other words - when it poops, you scoop!

Violation of these guidelines will result in a \$25.00 fine, per occurrence. (For specific details see the Board policy on pets and stray cats effective March, 2016). This policy applies to residents and their guests.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The damaged outflow pipe which connects Lake Bunting with the Horry County ditch has been successfully replaced. A dangerous sinkhole was created by the crumbling pipe. The replacement cost will come from the Infrastructure Fund which is provided for in the 2017 budget.


