#### **BOARD LISTENING SESSION**

The Board of Directors held its first listening session of 2017 on Friday, May 12th. There were approximately thirty-five (35) residents in attendance. There were about eight topics of concern, two of them being very familiar; lakes and speeding. Additional areas of concern were Common Ground, trees, signs and presentations in the Clubhouse. The concerns regarding lakes and speeding are discussed more thoroughly elsewhere in this issue of the *News & Views*.

#### SPEEDING SPEEDING

Several residents at the Board Listening Session expressed their concern regarding the rate of speed they perceive residents are driving in particular on Glenwood Drive. A somewhat lively discussion followed between residents of different opinions as to how to handle this concern. Options mentioned included installing speed bumps and lowering the speed limit. There are other options which can be investigated if the situation doesn't improve. However, the most cost efficient is if residents would please become more conscious of your driving habits and obey the speed limit. We must remember our streets are narrow and there is a great deal of activity on our streets; we don't have sidewalks, residents are riding their bikes and walking their pets. Fortunately, we have not had an accident in Myrtle Trace, to my knowledge, due to a resident speeding, but it only takes one.

#### CONDITION OF OUR RETENTION PONDS (LAKES)

A number of residents at the Board Listening Session expressed concerns regarding the conditions of our retention ponds; how they are no longer as pristine as they were years ago; due to the presence of algae, weeds and bank erosion. All of statements are true. Our retention ponds are much like the "old gray mare"; they ain't what they used to be.

The algae growth is encouraged by phosphates getting into the ponds from run-off and happens every year at this time. Several good rain storms would help the situation but as you know, the storms have been going north and west of our area. The weeds are sprayed by the company which treats our ponds.

#### PROPERTY COMMITTEE

#### USE OF RETENTION PONDS FOR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES

The bodies of water in Myrtle Trace are retention ponds, not lakes. The purpose of these ponds is manage storm water runoff to prevent flooding and erosion and to allow for sediment to settle. The ponds are treated to inhibit weed growth and algae formation and are not intended to be used for recreational purposes.

Swimming and the use of recreational water craft such as paddle boats, canoes, kayaks, row boats, paddle boards or other floating craft are not permitted on these ponds. The Lake Maintenance Company is allowed to use their boat for their maintenance work and residents are allowed to operate toy radio controlled boats for their pleasure. (Effective April 17, 2017)

### NOTES FROM THE TREASURER

As some of you may have noticed, the addition to the Clubhouse, which has been much needed, is progressing rapidly. As a reminder, the \$16,900 remaining to be paid (an advance of \$2,000 was paid in 2016) was expensed in 2016 and held in a balance sheet account for payment when the work is completed, so these funds do not affect the 2017 budget.

As more good news, the 2017 retaining wall program was completed at slightly over \$12,000, which was well within budget (actually below budget). Our year-to-date income continues to exceed budgeted income as contributions/assessments for home sales are ahead of budget by \$1,500, and our cash increased by a little over \$11,000 over March, 2017. Additionally, our year-to-date daily operating expenses continue to be under budget mainly due to some programs remaining to be completed (termite application for clubhouse, cabana and maintenance building; and sidewall replacement from pool toward clubhouse). One CD which is part of our Road Resurfacing designated funds, matured during April and has been reinvested.

In conclusion, at the end of April, the Association is in good shape financially going into the busy summer months.



## **BOARD BRIEFS (CONT'D.)**

However, there are times when spraying cannot be done due to high temperatures as it would potentially kill the fish.

Regarding "lake" bank erosion; for the past five years the association has been installing retaining walls to prevent further bank erosion. Members of the Lake Banks Committee walk around all of the retention ponds and measure the undercut and the slopes of the banks. This data is then compiled and a five year plan is developed for retaining walls installation.

Approximately a year ago the Board of Directors established a Lake Maintenance Committee and charged them with reviewing the conditions of our ponds and to recommend a long range plan to the Board. This committee has gathered a great deal information and is currently in the final stages of prioritizing actions and presenting their recommendations to the Board. You will be updated as to the recommendations made by the committee and where we will go from here.



#### ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

At the May Board of Directors Meeting, the Board approved a recommendation by the ARC that allows the use of wood grained doors for all phases in Myrtle Trace. At that time, the ARC did not address the Phase 8 concern regarding matching shutters. The new Guideline regulation will read: Shutters in Phase 8, when used in conjunction with a wood grain door, shall be a color compatible with the door color.

Now that summer weather has arrived, we remind all homeowners that regular lawn care is required by the Covenants. Tall, untrimmed grass and weeds bring snakes and other "critters" that are not pleasant to have in the community. We appreciate your diligence in maintaining your lawns in a fashion that enhances the beauty of Myrtle Trace. Thank you and enjoy the warm weather.
