REZONING REQUEST

Some of you may have noticed the rezoning sign which was posted adjacent to the Lakeside Crossing entrance. A request was made to the Horry County Planning Commission to change 2.8 acres from the current Planned Unit Development (PUD) to Multi-Residential Two (MRD2). The plan is to build twelve, single family, two story Charleston style homes. The commission approved the proposal and it will now go the Horry County Council. There will be three readings before any action on the proposal is taken by the council. Public input is allowed at the second reading. According to information received from county council office the first reading is scheduled for Tuesday, August 22nd, the second reading Tuesday, September 5th and the third reading Tuesday, September 19th.

Some of you may have noticed a section of new pavement in an area between Cricket Court and the Burning Ridge Road exit on Myrtle Trace Drive. This portion of the road developed two potholes while Santee Cooper was using a ditch-witch. They were installing a new 220 volt electrical line to replace an old line. NOTES FROM THE TREASURER

The Association's financial status continues to be in good shape as we complete the first half of 2017. Some highlights are as follows:

Our cash balances increased by \$7,545 over the end of May. Our total income for the month of June was slightly over \$200 more than budgeted. June daily operating expenses were under budget by a little over \$1,000 and the year-to-date operating expenses were under budget by \$13,778. However, a number of anticipated expenses did not occur as of the end of June and several of these should be completed in July. The bottom line is that excess revenues of \$64,130 over all daily and other expenses was favorable in budget by \$16,612. Of this excess, \$44,000 will be needed to cover the contributions to our two designated or reserve funds whose payments were delayed due to Hurricane Matthew. We plan to make these payments to those funds at the end of September, 2017. We need to maintain our budgeted expenses and income for the remainder of 2017, in order to have an additional \$52,000 for our 2017 contributions to those funds, which if available, will be paid in January, 2018. Praise be, the Clubhouse addition is finally completed. The remaining cost of \$16,900 will be paid out of funds set aside from the 2016 budget and do not impact the 2017 budget.
