BOARD BRIEFS

LAKE MAINTENANCE AND PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

David Atkins and Ellen Elliott presented to the Board of Directors the report and recommendations of the Lake Maintenance and Preservation Committee, concerning the health and maintenance needs of the lakes in Myrtle Trace. The recommendations include priority of actions, present and future. These recommendations will be carefully reviewed by the Board as it enters the initial budget planning for 2018 and will continue to work in cooperation with the committee. OLLI PRESENTATION

FIREWISE PROGRAM UPDATE

Some of you may have attended the Firewise presentation at our Clubhouse by Drake Carroll in 2016. Ellen Elliott discussed the process involved for a community such as Myrtle Trace to become a Firewise Community and some of the benefits. She said we are currently waiting for the results of the community assessment and an initial Firewise plan which is being developed by Drake Carroll, a South Carolina Firewise Field Coordinator.

CAPITAL CONTRIBUTION/CERTIFICATE OF ASSESSMENT POLICY

For a number of years, it has been the policy to charge a \$300.00 fee to the purchaser when buying a home in Myrtle Trace. Of this amount \$250.00, is the Capital Contribution and is considered the purchaser's contribution to the maintenance and improvement of Common Properties in Myrtle Trace; the remaining \$50.00 goes to the Certificate of Assessment.

The Board of Directors, based on the increasing costs of maintaining and preserving our Common Properties, has approved a revision to Capital Contribution policy which will go into effect on January 1, 2018. The new fee charged to the purchaser of a home sold in Myrtle Trace will be \$500.00; \$450.00 will be considered the Capital Contribution; \$50.00 for the Certificate of Assessment Fee. All other portions of the current policy, which was revised in 2015, remain unchanged.

They would prefer to hear from you prior to being taken advantage of, rather than having to inform you that very rarely can they help you after you've sent money.

LAKE MANAGEMENT AND PRESERVATION COMMITTEE REPORT SUMMARY

Charge

The committee, after review and discussion of the results of the bathymetry, will revisit the Tier One -Tier Three recommendations made in 2016. This committee will identify any immediate needs to be addressed and outline a specific plan of action for 2017 based on available funds. In addition, long range, multi-year plans including cost estimates and priorities for future budget consideration will be developed. -Nancy Southard, President, Myrtle Trace HOA

In February, 2017 the Board of Directors reconvened the Stormwater Management Committee for the purpose of reviewing recommendations of the previous year's plan completed in May, 2016. Two of the recommendations proposed in the 2016 plan have been implemented. In the fall of 2016, Bathymetry mapping of the lakes was completed by Estate Management. Bathymetry mapping is the study of underwater depth of lake or ocean floors. Drainage improvements behind Hickory Drive were completed in 2017 by the Board of Directors.

The committee met several times between February and May to address their charge. The outcome of the committee's work was several prioritized recommendations which were developed using the following criteria: Community benefit, Homeowner benefit, Cost/benefit ratio, Regulatory compliance, Safety, Immediacy of need.

Recommendations

These prioritized recommendations are presented as a plan to minimize the impact of storm water flooding in the event of hurricanes or other major weather events, as well as to improve the health and appearance of Myrtle Trace lakes.

<u>Tier One</u>: Restore the lakes to their original depth through a planned schedule of dredging.

<u>Tier Two</u>: Implement both one time and on-going initiatives to keep lake outfalls and culverts free of debris and silt, allowing water to flow freely. Narrow lake fingers with no outlet must also be kept debris free to maintain water quality.

<u>Tier Three</u>: Expand the emergency drainage system from Lakes Cormorant and Osprey by creating an additional outfall which would empty into the county ditch. This will reduce the potential for flooding of the 60 homes surrounding the two lakes.

Manage the water levels of Lakes Dove and Wren to maintain their health and appearance and reduce the manual labor required on a regular basis.

In addition, the committee agreed to three over all implementation recommendations:

To work closely with the Lake Banks Committee in implementing actions proposed in the lake maintenance plan.

To increase the annual contribution to the Lake Renewal Fund.

To appoint a special committee to oversee the implementation of plan recommendations; membership to consist of three to five individuals and a board liaison.


