They are the Hardee Maintenance team for checking all of the swales on common ground and cleaning them out where necessary. Al Hardee, though not required, came back nightly in the early evening to refill the gas tanks in the pumps thus enabling them to operate an additional three to four hours each day. In addition, several members of the community: Marty Tims, Vince and Paula Muti, Jan Notte, John and Barbara Walko and Sheilah Reynolds, assisted Roger Kirschner in moving the pool furniture to a safe location. Lastly, Jon Bourne was willing to send out an email message, to all residents on the emergency email database list, informing them of the preventative steps which were being taken. Again, we thank each and every one of you for your efforts.

COMMITTEE FOR IMPLEMENTING LAKE MAINTENANCE RECOMMENDATIONS:

Clemson's website (Clemson.edu/extension/horry) is an excellent source for additional information regarding testing and the choice of trees and shrubs.

Our weather this summer offered perfect conditions for lawns to contract Brown Patch disease. This is a fungus that, though inactive in winter, does winter-over, so now is a good time to apply a fungicide. Prevention is the best defense against this lawn malady. Wait until spring to fertilize the lawn.

NOTES FROM THE TREASURER

Our financial status remains sound for the period ending August 31, 2017. Our cash balances increased slightly over the month of July and our total income for August was \$791 more than budgeted. Our Year to Date income through August was \$2,599 more than budgeted, and our Year to Date daily operating expenses of \$246,887 were under budget by \$11,375. Some concern is that our utilities expenses for the year are over budget by \$4,104, mostly because of electrical expenses.

Our plan remains to make our 2016 contributions at the end of September to the two funds (Road and Designated funds) which were delayed due to Hurricane Matthew. We have Year to Date excess revenues which will allow us to do so. We must also continue to be financially responsible in order to have \$52,000 available for the 2017 contribution to two these funds which, if available, will be deposited in January, 2018. Barring any unanticipated large expenditures, we should finish the year in good financial shape.

One CD at Horry County Bank matured in August and was rolled over. An additional five CD's will mature between now and the end of 2017.
