BOARD BRIEFS

LISTENING SESSION

The Board of Directors would like to remind all homeowners of the Listening Session being held on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 7th at 9:30 a.m.</u> in the Clubhouse. If you have any questions or concerns, this is an opportunity to bring them to the Board's attention.

MTHOA GUIDELINES AND POLICIES

In early November, each household will receive a 3-ring binder containing the latest edition of ARC Guidelines, Property Guidelines, Board/General Policies and Article VII of the Master Covenants. This binder will provide residents with ready access to these important documents and also enable future revisions and/or additions to be printed and page(s) substituted or added eliminating the need of reprinting the entire document. Homeowners are being asked to leave the binder and its contents in the home, for the new owner, when the house is sold.

TREE REMOVAL:

We are asking homeowners when having trees removed from their property to inform their tree contractor that trees are NOT to be dropped on our roads. The two main reasons being; our roads are private, therefore it becomes an association expense to repair the damage, and dropping trees on the roads creates a traffic problem.

NOTES FROM THE TREASURER

As of the end of September, reviewing our Balance Sheet shows our cash balances decreased by \$1,752 over the month of August and our Prepaid dues balance decreased by \$11,881 over July to \$44,044, which was anticipated.

However, our Income and Expense Analysis shows total income for September being slightly more than budgeted by \$284, and Year-to-date income through September being \$2,864 more than budgeted. Our September daily operating expenses were under budget by \$8,475, with Year-to-date daily operating expenses being under budget by \$19,849. Our Year-to-date utilities costs were over budget by \$4,337, due mostly to electrical usage. A number of items which had been planned for, but have not taken place as of September, such as the sidewalk repair between the pool and clubhouse and termite application for several buildings will show up in the October expenses as this work will be completed.

Our bottom line is that we are still in good shape financially as we enter the last three months of the year, and should remain so, barring any large, unforeseen circumstances.


