The Board would like to thank the members of the LPAC for the time and effort they have put into this phase of lake dredging. They are doing a great job.

#### NOTES FROM THE TREASURER

Well, we made it through 2017 with a major unforeseen event. As a result, we ended the year in good financial condition. Our yearto-date total income through December was \$3,779 more than budgeted. Also, our year-to date daily operating expenses of \$376,999 was under budget by \$7,266. The bottom line is that year-to-date excess revenues of \$137,964 over all daily and other expenses was a favorable budget of \$2,970 when you remove the budgeted figures for the annual contributions to the existing and new funds which need to be set aside Contributions to these funds will take place during the January/February time frame This includes \$15,007 for our Designated (Repair & Replacement) Fund, Road Resurfacing Fund of \$31,080, Lake Renewal Fund (dredging) of \$15,065, Infrastructure Fund of \$2,364, and Emergency (or Disaster) Fund of \$19,256, for a total transfer of \$82,772. This leaves approximately \$55,211 plus a bank balance of \$20,204, which will be used to finance the normal expenses for the first two months of 2018 (between \$30,000 to \$35,000 monthly).

In short, we are well positioned financially for 2018, without a dues increase. In conclusion, this is my last edition of "Notes from the Treasurer", as my term on the Board expires at the conclusion of our upcoming Annual Meeting. It has been my pleasure to serve you and I hope you have enjoyed these financial notes.






