BOARD BRIEFS

FACILITY USE POLICY:

The Board of Directors approved an amendment to Section II Function Participation of the Facility Use Policy. The amendment reads as follows: *“Where a single resident or homeowner is domiciled alone in a Myrtle Trace home, such resident or homeowner may bring one nonresident guest to the event or activity with priority equivalent to that of joint homeowners sharing domicile in such a home. If space permits, other guests of residents may RSVP to such events during the five (5) days prior to the RSVP deadline. Such guests, when accompanied by the sponsoring resident will be welcomed to the event or activity for which an RSVP has been submitted.”*

The Facility Use Policy will be printed in its entirety and distributed to all residents of Myrtle Trace at a future date. The policy should then be placed in the Myrtle Trace Guidelines and Policy notebook, which was distributed earlier this year.

ROAD SURFACE:

For a number of years we have been patching and crack sealing portions of Myrtle Trace Drive. Earlier this year members of the Board walked a long section of Myrtle Trace Drive and discussed whether it was time to start repaving. Tom Gray of the Property Committee obtained a couple of estimates for repaving one-half mile of road; the range was from \$150,000.00 to \$195,000.00. These estimates would require using more than one-half of the funds currently available in the Road Resurfacing Fund and would not include the cost for milling which also would be required. The Board met with a representative of Pavement Solutions Company (PSC) to explore an alternative to repaving. He told us our roads are in need of work, but total repaving is not necessary. The alternative would be to either spray seal or squeegee seal which would extend the life of the road. The price given for sealing all of Myrtle Trace Drive was \$23,344.00. This does not include some additional patching and crack sealing which would need to be done prior to sealing. The Board has approved the sealing of Myrtle Trace Drive. The work is scheduled to be done in early December although the exact dates have not been determined. PLEASE see flier included in this issue of News & Views for some important additional information. When a starting date has been set, you will receive notification and any necessary instructions.

POOL REPAIRS

Those residents who use the pool may have noticed several areas in the shallow end where the plaster has come off. At the September Board meeting, the Board approved the expenditure of \$3,800.00 to make repairs to the pool including: fixing the bad areas and re-plastering the entire shallow end from the transition line to the bottom of the steps; applying new caulk between the top row of tiles and the rim edge of the pool; and repairing several spots on the deck area where paint has started to peel due to a problem with the underlying material. The areas on the deck will be touched up with paint at a later date. Update: the pool repairs have been completed.

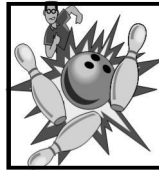
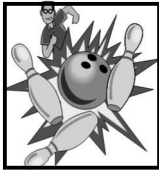

MTCC Christmas Programs

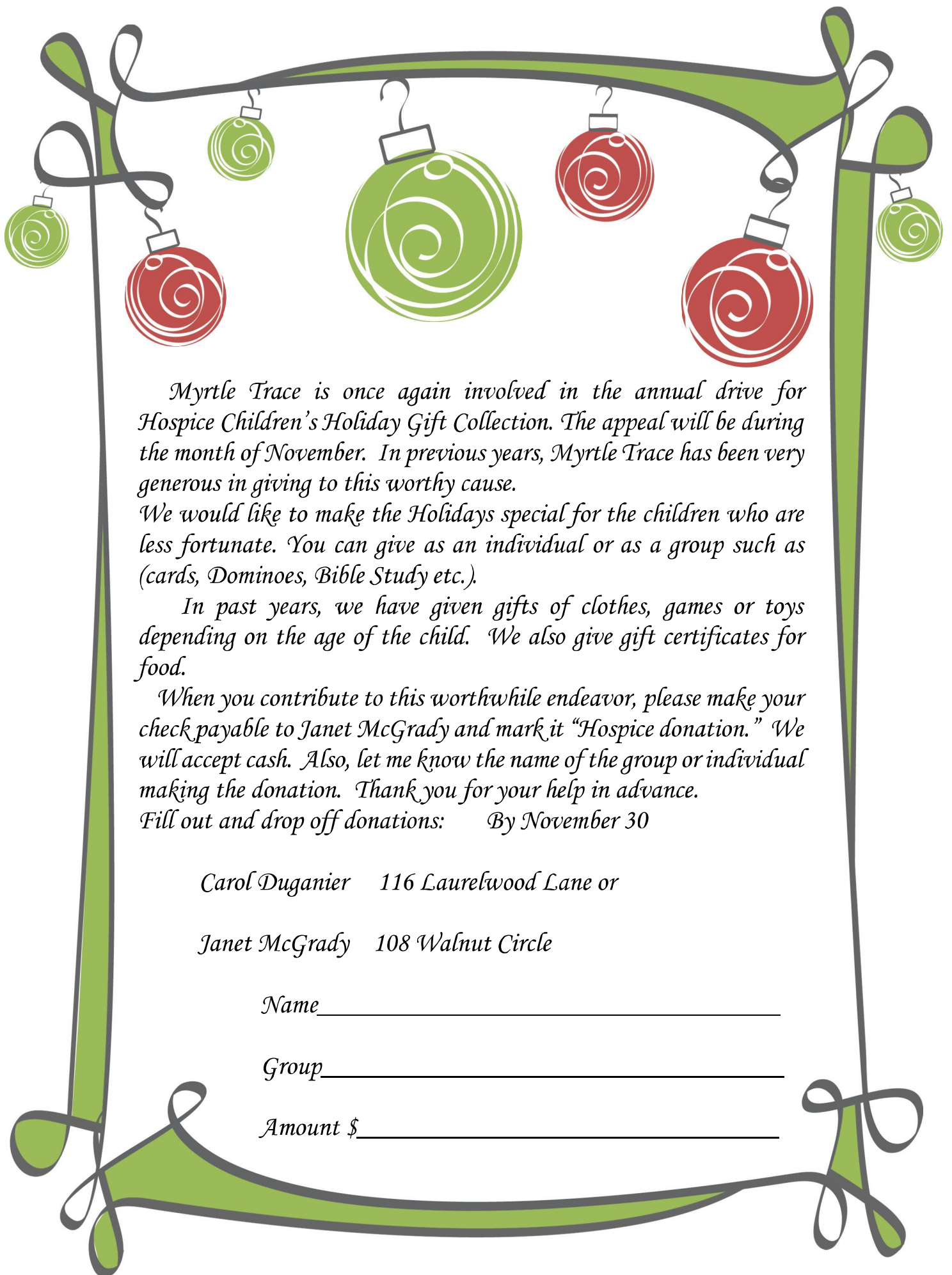

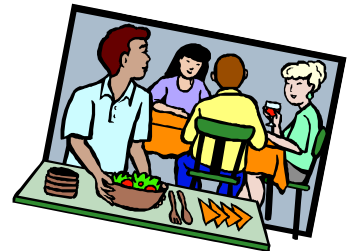
