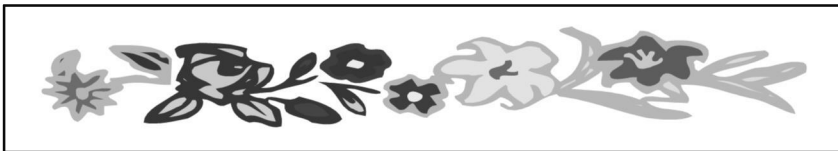
PROPERTY COMMITTEE

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

We hope everyone is enjoying the spring weather with plenty of warm weather and now some much needed rain. We have been reviewing many project requests and we thank you for your diligence in sending them to us. We would like to remind everyone of a few violations that have been occurring recently.

1. Tree removal contractors have been dropping trees in the road. Remember these are our roads, not state or county and all damage to the roads, we have to fix at our expense. If you have a tree removed, please remind them not to drop the trees in the road.

2. Contractors are not allowed to post signs on your property when doing a project for you. Please do not allow them to do this.

3. Contractors are not allowed to leave trucks or trailers on your property when not actively working on your project. (ex. over the weekend or overnight). You, as the homeowner, may be fined \$100 per day for this occurrence which you may pass along to your contractor.
