BOARD BRIEFS





BUDGET

At its November meeting, the Board advised all present that the budget for 2020 has been finalized. Starting January 1, 2020, the dues will increase from \$82.50 to \$85.00 per month. The primary reason for the increase is the need to increase the balances in the Infrastructure and Disaster reserve accounts. The infrastructure throughout the Community is 20 to 35 years old and the costs of repairs have increased over the years. In addition, the Board feels that the \$27,000 balance in the disaster account needs to be increased based on figures from previous years.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Rich McEvoy has resigned as Chairman of the Property Committee. His valuable contributions to the community over the past few years are deeply appreciated. Fortunately, he will continue to serve on the committee. The Board welcomes Liz Maass who has agreed to chair the committee going forward.

The Property Committee is seeking bids to restore the section of the berm along Myrtle Ridge Road which had to be removed when the well was replaced.

CLUBHOUSE KITCHEN

The contract for the kitchen refurbishment has been signed and the Clubhouse will be closed for six (6) weeks commencing on January 6, 2020. The Board is looking for a place to hold meetings during that time. More information will be in the next News & Views and on our website.


